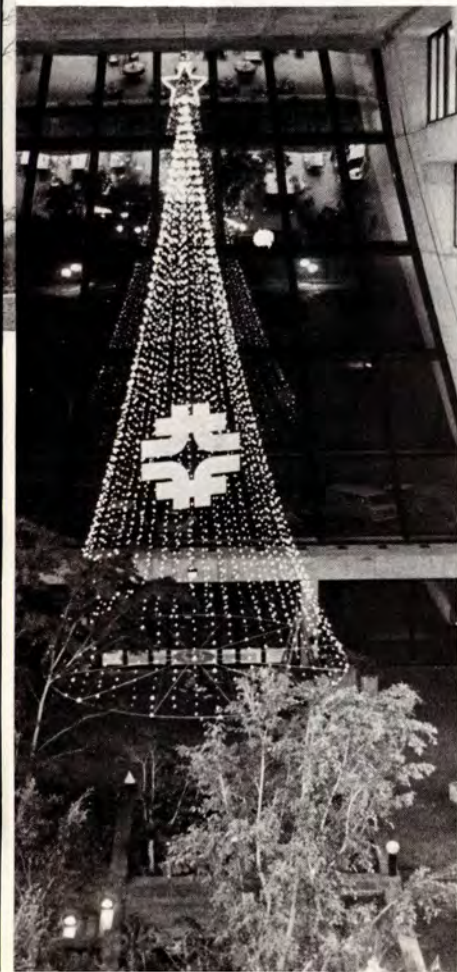

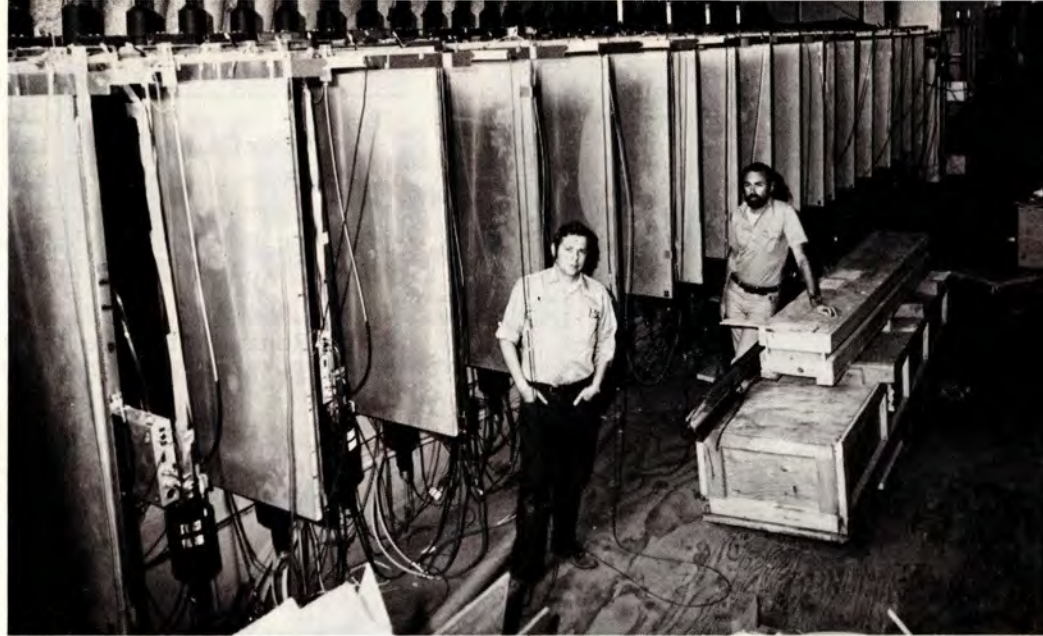
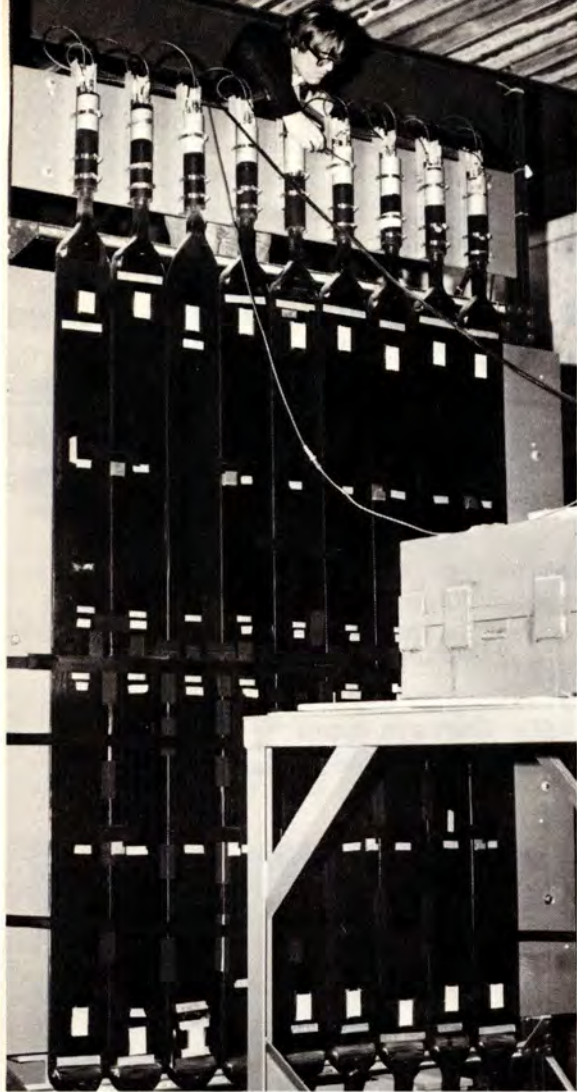
Happy New Year!
