DECEMBER PROGRAMS AT FERMILAB

Fermilab's second bicentennial lecture on Friday, December 5, will feature Richard Underwood, international authority on space photography. The lecture, entitled, "Photography from Manned Spacecraft," will be given in the Auditorium at 8:30 p.m.

Mr. Underwood will come from the Lyndon B. Johnson Space Center in Houston, Texas. He has been associated for many years with the Gemini, Apollo, Skylab, and Earth Resources programs of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). He is now a consultant to many of the NASA programs at the Johnson Space Center.

Mr. Underwood is a photographer as well as a lecturer. He is an internationally-known authority on photogrammetry, photographic sciences and aerospace photography. His lecture will include slides of the local area taken from 200 miles above the ground.

The Bicentennial Lecture Series is sponsored by the Fermilab Auditorium Committee and offered to the Fermilab community and to the general public at no admission charge. As part of the celebration of the United States Bicentennial the series brings insights into recent scientific advances in the United States. The first in the series, on October 26, presented Robert March in "From Franklin to Fermilab..."

During the month of December a photographic display of the architecture of Dankmar Adler and Louis Henri Sullivan by Ralph Marlowe Line will be on exhibition in the second floor lounge of the Central Laboratory. Mr. Line, professor emeritus in the Department of Architecture of the University of Illinois, began to photograph these historic buildings in 1944. His exhibit includes 85 prints, brought to Fermilab through the arrangement of David Sauer, now Director of Fermilab Site Services, a colleague of Line at the University of Illinois.

"The work of Adler and Sullivan represents the breakthrough and start of what is now known as 'American' architecture," Sauer notes. "At a time when we are reconsidering where we've been in our country's history, there is renewed interest in the fundamental contributions made by Adler and Sullivan.

"Professor Line's photographs include many of the Adler-Sullivan edifices that no longer exist and this is the only record we have of these outstanding buildings.

Louis Henri Sullivan (1818-1924) and Dankmar Adler (1844-1900) formed an architectural partnership in Chicago in 1881. Frank Lloyd Wright worked as an assistant in the partnership at one time. The exhibit at Fermilab illustrates the architectural forms and ornate ornamental detail of this architectural period. Some of the photos are of residences built in the Chicago area. Among the public buildings shown in the exhibit are the Auditorium Building in Chicago (now Roosevelt University); the Wainwright Building (St. Louis); the original Schlesinger and Mayer Department Store, Chicago (now Carson Pirie Scott).

The exhibit is presented at Fermilab through the kindness of Mr. Line. It is open to the Fermilab community and to the general public at no charge during the regular visiting hours. A catalog accompanies the exhibit.

FERMILAB MEMBERSHIP IN TENNIS CLUB



PERSONNEL INFORMATION AVAILABLE

+ PERSONNEL NEWS AND NOTES +

+ Employees with health problems or suspected problems should be aware that the +
+ Medical Catastrophe (Major Medical) Insurance portion of the Fermilab employee medical +
+ insurance policy covers doctor visits. A \$100.00 deductible per individual covered by +
+ the policy, per calendar year, must be satisfied before the insurance payment applies. +
+ (Each dependent's coverage is also subject to the \$100.00 deductible.) Once the +
+ \$100.00 deductible has been met the insurance will pay 80% of succeeding office visits +
+ for the rest of the year. +

+ For example, if an employee covered by Major Medical insurance had doctor visit +
+ expenses in 1975 totaling \$150.00, the employee would be responsible for \$100.00 of +
+ this amount, and the Major Medical insurance would pay 80% of \$50.00. This means that +
+ the Major Medical is really paying \$40.00 of the \$150.00 incurred through these doctor +
+ visits. This is also true if one or more doctors have been seen. This arrangement is +
+ also true of dependent coverage. +
