## SET FOR TORNADO SEASON HERE

The recent pre-season tornado threat in the western suburbs found Fermilab's weather warning system "on top of the situation all the way," according to Rudy Dorner, Site Manager, who also serves as Fermilab Emergency Coordinator.

Fermilab's principal source of weather information is Murray and Trettel, Inc., meteorological consultants serving many large organizations, corporations, radio and television stations. Information is also available from the National Warning System and the Emergency Broadcast System. But both of these provide information based on wide geographical areas; M & T obtains and analyses information that is pinpointed to the Fermilab site.

On Friday, March 12, for example, at 6:45 a.m. M & T reported that there would be high winds on the Fermilab site with tornado possibilities to the north and to the south of the Laboratory, but not on the ten square miles of the Fermilab site. Tornadoes did touch at least two areas eight miles from the Laboratory, to the southwest and southeast. At Fermilab high winds prevailed most of the day, but there was no wind damage on site.

The Site-Wide Emergency Plan developed by the Fermilab Safety Office sets out a detailed plan for severe weather warning at Fermilab. Murray and Trettel forecasts are the first step in these severe weather warnings. Conditions reported by Murray and Trettel are severe weather watch, thunderstorm warning, tornado watch, tornado warning, and all clear at the end of an emergency condition. If some action is necessary, the Emergency Operator at the Fermilab switchboard goes into action relaying appropriate information to a call list of persons responsible for taking precautionary measures at the Laboratory. This sets in motion a site-wide network of emergency action involving many persons who have assignments to carry out.

A siren in the Village and another at the Safety Office on site, and a portable siren with the same warning signal in the Atrium of the Central Laboratory can be sounded as quickly as necessary.

"It's important for everyone to realize that even though nothing seems to be happening when the sky is getting dark and the wind starts blowing at Fermilab, that we are watching closely all weather conditions that might affect the site in any way," Dorner advises.

If anyone must have more information about weather conditions, call the Safety Office, Ext. 3580 where Marilyn Kasules keeps a weather monitor in operation at all times. Do not call the Emergency Coordinator or the Switchboard; both may be very busy with an emergency situation and may need to have telephone lines clear. The Safety Office will be glad to answer any other questions about safety during tornado conditions.

The March training sessions for floor wardens in the Central Laboratory will include instructions for tornado emergency procedures.

## GET READY FOR SUMMER '76

The 1976 swimming pool season at Fermilab will open on Saturday, May 22 at 9:00 a.m. In order to plan ahead for good pool operation, memberships will be sold beginning April 1. The pool will again provide recreational and social opportunities for the Laboratory staff and visitors. This year pool membership is open to the Fermilab staff, their guests; visiting experimenters and their families; the ERDA Office at Fermilab, and employees of RRS Inc., Security System, and Mercury Management personnel working at Fermilab.

Pool use is limited to persons holding current pool memberships and their accompanied paid guests.

Individuals must display a pool tag, weekly pass, or daily pass to gain entry into the pool.

Season memberships to the pool may be purchased from the Fermilab Cashier, CL4E, beginning Thursday, April 1 from 8:30 - 5:00 p.m. The seasonal rates for the pool membership are as follows:

Single Person	\$15.00
Married Couple	\$25.00
Family	\$30.00

A new feature of the pool this year will be a weekly pass. The weekly pass will be sold to individuals for \$5.00 per week at the Cashier's Desk beginning Thursday, May 20. Without pool membership tags, persons wishing to use the pool may pay an admission fee at the swimming pool of \$1.00 per day. Admission charges to the pool will be strictly enforced.

The pool schedule is as follows:

### Weekdays

6:00 a.m. - 8:00 a.m. - adults only, no lifeguard  
11:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. - family swimming, lifeguard on duty

### Weekends and Holidays

9:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. - family swimming, lifeguard on duty

Swimming instruction for children will again be part of the pool program. The lessons will be taught by a certified Water Safety Instructor. Class schedules will be published at a later date.

The pool operation will be administered by Jane Theis, Recreation Coordinator, all questions should be directed to her at Ext. 3126.
