JOHN G. SEMMELMAN

John G. Semmelman, a technical specialist in the NAL Accelerator Division, lost his life in a swimming mishap on Saturday, August 18, 1973.

John came to NAL in June of 1969, following nine years' service as a technician at the Argonne National Laboratory. He began his work at NAL in the former Radio Frequency Section, now part of the Accelerator Division. In a recent reorganization of the mechanical section of the Accelerator Division, John was given supervision of all of the vacuum work in the Division.

John resided at 1 S 731 South Ellyn Road, Glen Ellyn. He is survived by his wife Shirley and two daughters, Patricia Bareither, and Claudia. Funeral services were held in Glen Ellyn on Wednesday, August 22.

Max Palmer voices the feelings of John's associates in the Accelerator Division: "John was more than a fellow worker, he was a friend, always concerned about how everyone was doing and ready to help with personal problems, as well as being concerned with how the accelerator was running.

"Boating and swimming were John's favorite hobbies, and it was while doing what he enjoyed most that he had this accident. All the members of the mechanical section will miss John; he leaves a void that will be hard to fill."

CHICAGO MEETING OFFERS UNUSUAL ENTERTAINMENT

A rare opportunity will be available in Chicago from August 28 to September 8, when 4,000 scholars meet at the IX International Congress of Anthropological and Ethnological Sciences to be held at the Conrad Hilton Hotel. Theme of the Congress is "One Species, Many Cultures," based on the thesis that the well-being of mankind depends upon recognition and respect for group differences. Anyone may register to attend the 100 scheduled scholarly sessions by paying a \$5.00 per day fee, or \$25 for the entire Congress, which also entitles one to many discounts on publications of the Congress. The Congress, a UNESCO-related organization, meets at 5-year intervals and will not meet in the U.S. again before the year 2,000.

Special events accompanying the Congress include a premiere performance of a Gian Carlo Menotti opera and a folk concert illustrating the variety of creative traditions alive in America, developed by the Smithsonian Institution, with Pete Seeger as master of ceremonies. Title of the opera is "Tamu-Tamu," an opera for the whole world. A dozen groups, representing Cajun social musical, Black shape-note singers, the Sacred Harp singing group, and other authentic performers of American folk life, will perform at the concert.
