1988-89 TEVATRON Collider Run Sets New Records

On September 7, 1988, the TEVATRON at Fermilab reached its design luminosity of 10^{30} cm⁻²sec⁻¹. During the week of September 9 through September 12, 1988, the TEVATRON achieved a new record initial luminosity of 1.25×10^{30} cm⁻²sec⁻¹. (For purposes of comparison, CERN's previous record luminosity was 4×10^{29} †.) The TEVATRON's integrated luminosity for one week reached 204 inverse nanobarns, while the integrated luminosity for one store was 50.1 inverse nanobarns (CERN's best to date: 22.9†).

The largest pbar stack equaled 46.6 milliamps (CERN has had about 60^{\dagger}), and 142 milliamps of pbars were stacked during that week, with an average stacking rate of 1.16 milliamps per hour. There were three stores with initial luminosity > 10^{30} :

In Memoriam

John T. (Terry) Carroll 1942-1988

Dr. John T. (Terry) Carroll, 45, passed away on Saturday, September 3, 1988, at his home in Aurora. Dr. Carroll was a physicist with the Collider Detector at Fermilab. Previously, Dr. Carroll had been at the Stanford Linear Accelerator, and at CERN where, in 1981-1982, he was a member of the UA-1 team that discovered the W particle.

Dr. Carroll graduated *magna cum laude* from St. Mary's College in Winona, Minnesota; he received his masters and Ph.D. in physics from the University of Wisconsin.

He is survived by his wife, Lee, daughter Farren, his parents, two sisters, and one brother.

Memorial donations in Dr. Carroll's name may be made to the Interfaith Food Pantry in Aurora.

Under the leadership of Gerry Dugan, the accelerator has thus far delivered 625 inverse nb. Two hundred and four of these were delivered from the 5th through the 12th. Thus, the prospects are very encouraging for the Collider Detector at Fermilab reaching and even exceeding the goal of 1000 inverse nanobarns on tape for the 1988-1989 Collider run.

(† Comparisons with CERN results are as of press date. CERN's 1988 Collider run with their new ACOL machine should be just under way as you read this. It is expected that CERN performance figures will be substantially improved in the near future, so we may be in for a real horse race.)

Benefits Notes

New Rules on SRA's

Starting January 1, 1989, TIAA-CREF supplemental retirement account withdrawals will be subject to the same rules as mutual-fund SRA's.

The Tax Reform Act prohibits cash with-drawals from any SRA unless you are 59-1/2 or older, terminate your employment, are disabled, withdraw the funds because of "hardship" (not yet defined by the IRS), or if the money is to be distributed as a death benefit.

If you are planning to use your TIAA-CREF SRA's for retirement, you should do nothing. However, if you are using your SRA as a savings account for some future purchase, you may want to consider a withdrawal (subject to a 10% tax penalty) before the new restrictions apply. It is possible that the new rules governing withdrawals will be less harsh. As currently drafted, the Technical Correction Act pending in Congress would permit access to amounts accumulated in your SRA before 1989.

If you decide to make a withdrawal before the new restrictions take effect, the distribution must be made by TIAA-CREF by December 31, 1988. To insure that your check can be issued by then, all forms, properly completed, should be received by Friday, December 16, 1988. SRA withdrawal forms can be obtained by calling 1-800-842-2777.
