in which each person can contribute for the benefit of the many. The participants were reminded that the food they had just consumed was more than the average meal for a homeless person.

The winter months are especially hard for the homeless. If everybody contributes in their own way (volunteerism, money, food, clothing) to the local shelters and food pantries, or the United Way, these small contributions can help to alleviate a small portion of the burden on the less fortunate.

Security Subjects

ATM Safety

Recent news stories have highlighted the need for caution when using automatic teller machines (ATM). The Fermilab Security Department recommends the following guidelines for your personal and account protection.

Personal Safety:

• When you approach an ATM, whether it is located in an enclosed vestibule, on the street, or at a drive-up, be aware of your surroundings.

Do not use an ATM if: the lights at the site are not operating; you see suspicious persons near the machine; you have any doubts, fears, or concerns.

• Park your car in a well-lit area near the ATM. Check the surrounding area before leaving the safety of your car. Be sure to remove your keys from the ignition before leaving your car.

- When using a drive-up ATM, be sure all windows but the driver's are closed and the doors are locked. Keep your engine running. Be aware of individuals loitering on foot in the area.
- If you sense an individual crowding you or attempting to view your transaction, cancel the transaction and leave the ATM location.
- After you finish your cash transaction, keep your cash hidden. Immediately place it in your wallet or purse before leaving the ATM.
- As you leave an enclosed ATM vestibule, do not open the door to a person waiting outside to gain entry. That person should gain entry by using their ATM card to unlock the door.
- If you are followed from the ATM, go to a safe place where there are people, activity, and security. Call your local police department and report any suspicious activity. Report all incidents to bank management or security.

Account Protection:

- Memorize your personal identification number (PIN). Do not write it on your card or give it out over the phone to persons claiming to be police or bank officials.
- Guard against others observing you keying-in your PIN at the ATM. Use your body to shield the keyboard.
- Keep your receipts and inspect your banking statement monthly. Report all suspicious or unauthorized transactions immediately.
- Immediately report lost or stolen ATM cards to your financial institution and file a report with your local police. (Source: Citicorp information pamphlet) W. Flaherty
