BUSINESS OFFICE CONSOLIDATES IN NEW CENTRAL LAB OFFICES

The consolidation into the Central Laboratory building is now bringing together groups that have been located in many different places on the Laboratory site for the last several years. The Business Office is one of these groups. Recently, several Business Office functions came together for the first time as several subdivisions of the Business Office moved into the fourth floor of the Central Laboratory. Increased efficiency and the convenience of being in close touch with others in the same working group are now possible for these FermiLab people.

Other Business Office subdivisions include Information Systems, soon ready to occupy a new location on 4E, and Support Services, headquartered in the Receiving Area. The Duplicating facilities are still in the Village; T & M subcontracts group recently re-located to the former Phillips Farm. Receiving and warehouse facilities are a part of Support Services, as are now the Material Management functions. Total staff of the Business office includes about 150 FermiLab employees.

The move of the Business Office to the Central Laboratory came at the same time that James E. Finks, Jr., assumed the position of FermiLab Business Manager. He succeeds James R. Campbell who has been appointed Vice President of Queens College, Flushing, Long Island, New York. Jim Finks has been Assistant Business Manager of the Laboratory since July, 1973.

Jim graduated from the University of Virginia where he received his Bachelor of Electrical Engineering degree in 1961. From 1959 to 1966 he was employed as an engineer by Sperry Marine Systems Division of the Sperry Rand Corporation, Charlottesville, Virginia. During his last three years there he moved into engineering administrative work in research and development programs as well as over-all program and project control.

In July 1966 Jim joined the staff of the National Radio Astronomy Observatory in Charlottesville serving as Budget/Personnel Officer until 1969 when he was named Business Manager of the Observatory, responsible for the budgeting, personnel, purchasing, shipping, receiving, and property control of the Observatory's three facilities --one in Charlottesville, one in Green Bank, West Virginia, and another in Tucson, Arizona. During that time he was also involved in the budgeting and setting up of the Observatory's new Very Large Array project to be constructed in New Mexico.

Jim and his wife, Louise, live at 1028 Pine St., Batavia. They have three children -- Delia 13, Jim, 10, and Bobby, 6.

Jim Campbell and his family will leave for New York August 12. They will reside in Port Washington, L.I., New York.

Support Services recently began taxi service for on-site travel at the FermiLab. The taxi service is intended to aid visitors in the experimental areas who may be without transportation, as well as the many employees who now use car pools. A FermiLab driver is dispatched by Roger Braun, Ext. 3171, usually within ten minutes, for point-to-point business travel at the Laboratory from 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m., and 1:30 p.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. During the noon hours, Support Services' two small busses will continue to circulate on the two routes they have used in recent months. FBI ANNOUNCES ARREST

* * * * *

Richard G. Held, Special Agent in Charge of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Chicago, announced on July 17 the arrest of Timothy Brennan and John Noreikis for possession of stolen Government property. These men are alleged to have had in their possession three Tektronix Oscilloscopes that had been reported stolen from FermiLab. Brennan resides at 313 S. Elmwood Drive, Aurora, and Noreikis resides at 510 Hardin, Aurora. Noreikis was employed as an electrician at the FermiLab until his dismissal on July 19.

The Laboratory and the FBI investigate the disappearance of goods reported stolen at FermiLab. Such thefts should be reported to the Site Manager's Office, Ext. 3494, as soon as they are discovered. Since FermiLab property is U.S. Government Property, the FBI has the authority to investigate any theft at the site. Maximum penalty for unauthorized possession of Government Property is ten years or a \$10,000 fine or both. Advance Industrial Security Company personnel are on duty 24 hours a day at the Laboratory to provide protection of the site and the property at the site against vandalism and theft.

In this connection, the Director of the Laboratory has emphasized that measures against theft of Laboratory property are being intensified and that all cases will be dealt with, as in this example, severely. Anyone, he said, who is stealing from this Laboratory is stealing from you, first in your capacity as a citizen and a taxpayer, but secondly and even more directly, from you as a sharer of our already inadequate funds, which in large part must directly pay our salaries.
