

NEW ACCESS ROAD PLANNED FOR CENTRAL LABORATORY AREA

Plans are being developed for a new access road from the Central Laboratory area to the western boundary of the NAL site. It will be a unique, scenic and curving roadway with two lanes—one lane going into the site and another going out. The roadway will leave the Central Laboratory area at its western edge and connect with Pine Drive at the recently-improved Kirk Road. Engineers are designing the road to provide maximum appreciation of the wooded environment and of the high rise building that will house the Central Laboratory in the footprint area. The two lanes for the roadway will not parallel each other. It is hoped that the roadway can be built during the current fiscal year although because of funding problems there is a possibility that its completion might be scheduled for late 1972.

Meantime, a new, wide road has been built at the western boundary of the NAL site. It is a smooth, four-lane asphalt highway (Kirk Road) running 2.8 miles from Wilson Street, near the northern edge of NAL's site to Butterfield Road, at the southern boundary. The road includes a four-foot median and curbs and gutter. There is an opening for the main entrance to NAL at Pine Street, Batavia, on this section of newly-completed Kirk Road. We understand that plans are being completed for a bridge to cross the Chicago and North-western Railway tracks and Roosevelt Road at the eastern end of Geneva--the present main traffic hazards as one proceeds north on Kirk Road.

In several years, the Highway Department expects that Kirk Road traffic will move

across a four-lane highway of similar construction from the East-West Tollway to North Avenue (Route 64) at the eastern edge of St. Charles.

Meantime, Batavia Mayor Robert Brown has announced that Illinois Route 25 south of Batavia will be closed for construction of a new bridge over the old Chicago, Aurora and Elgin R.R. right-of-way, which is now part of the Illinois Prairie Path. Construction time is estimated at approximately three months. The road will be completely barricaded north and south of the bridge. Detour signs will be posted. Route 25 is approximately a mile west of the NAL site and is used generally as a link between Elgin and Aurora.

The State of Illinois Highway Department plans to begin work soon on widening Illinois Route 59 to four lanes from North Avenue (Route 64) to the East-West Tollway. In addition, work is progressing on the widening and improvement of the Averill-Barton Road from Illinois Highway 25, at the eastern edge of the Fox River, to Illinois Highway Alternate 30 (Roosevelt Road). This project is 3.9 miles long and will cost about 1.3 million dollars.
