## NATIVE BIRDS RETURNED TO FERMILAB

Twelve pair of bob white quail joined the growing Fermilab family recently, the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Getzelman of Hinckley, Illinois. The birds were released in the center of the Fermilab Main Ring by the Getzelmans and Sal Cuomo, Food Services Manager, also of Hinckley, who arranged with the Getzelmans to bring the birds to Fermilab.

Mr. and Mrs. Getzelman have raised quail as a hobby for several years at their country home where they also carry on their business of custom decorated china items for special celebrations as well as raising miniature Schnauzer dogs. With 15 pair of quail as stock, they collected 100 eggs a week this past spring. They incubated the eggs and hatched 600 quail chicks for the season. The Getzelmans have sold enough birds to pay for the flock's feed, to gun clubs and other people who wanted to raise or keep the birds. The Getzelmans release the rest in the area in suitable numbers--about 120 recently.

Bob white quail are flock birds. They fly from the ground in a whooshing covey when they are disturbed. At night they guard against predators by sleeping in a circle with heads pointed out, tails in the center. Their well-known "bob-bob white" call will soon be heard above the four-mile tunnel of the Fermilab main accelerator. Quail are native to the Illinois prairie, most prominent in Southern Illinois. They will be found where there is thick grass cover and shrubs, well camouflaged by their mottled brown coloring. They reach about two pounds' weight when full grown. According to the Getzelmans, the quail will adapt quickly to their new environment, coming at a time when ample weed seeds will be available. They will be right at home in the restored prairie planned for the center of the Main Ring.

Students in biology from many colleges in the suburban areas have been invited to join Fermilab people in a seed harvest for the Fermilab Prairie Restoration during the first weeks of October. The seeds will be dried during the winter and sown in a prepared ten acres in the Main Ring in the spring of 1975.

An informational meeting about the Fermilab Prairie Restoration will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, September 26th in the Fermilab Auditorium. Dr. Robert Betz, Professor of Biology at Northeastern Illinois University, and Ray Schulenberg, Naturalist of the Morton Arboretum, will lecture and show slides.

Voters may register in Illinois until October 7 to vote in the November elections. A voter must have lived in the precinct in which he will vote for 30 days before the election and must be a U.S. citizen and be 18 years old by election day.

In DuPage County, registrations are made in the DuPage County Complex on County Farm Road west of Wheaton, in the Election Board Office which is open Mon.-Fri. from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Sat., 9 a.m. to noon, or at all village and city halls.

In Kane County, an election board office is located at the Kane County Court House on 3rd St., in Geneva. Regular office hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Mon.-Fri. On Oct. 3rd and 4th, the office will be open from 6-9 p.m. and on Sat., Oct. 5, from 9 a.m. to noon.


