FFLA Offers Teachers Summer of Learning at Lab

Sixty high-school science and mathematics teachers (15 each in biology, chemistry, physics, and mathematics) are spending four weeks at Fermilab participating in the Summer Institute for Science Teachers (SIST). The Institute is sponsored by the Friends of Fermilab Association (FFLA) for the purpose of updating and increasing knowledge for teachers in various disciplines.

The teachers spend three mornings each week attending lectures on specialties in their fields. For example, the biology teachers are being presented with "Cell Structure and Function Theories" by Dr. Guenter Albrecht-Buehler from Northwestern University, "Ecological Theories" by Dr. Terry Marsh from North Central College and Dr. Herbert Lamp from the University of Chicago, "Animal Behavior Concepts" by the staff of the Brookfield Zoo, and "Molecular Genetics Theories" by Dr. Hewson Swift from the University of Chicago.


All 60 teachers spend the remaining two mornings of each week in plenary sessions learning about the latest developments on the research forefront of several disciplines. Topics vary from "Lasers and Holography" by Dr. Tung Jeong of Lake Forest College, to "Making Every Minute Count in the Classroom" by Dr. David R. Johnson of Nicolet High

School in Milwaukee, Wisc., "AIDS: Separating Fact from Fear" by Dr. James Hagen of Loyola University, and "Superconductivity" by Dr. Frank Fradin of Argonne National Laboratory. Selected topics cover all four areas of interest (biology, chemistry, physics, and mathematics). Many speakers are challenging the participants to carry these topics to the classroom in some form so that more of their students will be motivated to join the science community.

The teachers spend their afternoons trying new labs, learning computer programming and word-processing, writing programs to incorporate video disc images into a tutorial program for students, and writing a self-guided tour booklet for high-school students to use at Brookfield Zoo. Group presentations are a vital part of the program. This provides an opportunity for collaboration with colleagues to develop usable materials for the classroom with new equipment and techniques.

An overnight outing at the Indiana Dunes and Forest Beach Conference Center provides an opportunity for all the teachers to experience the benefit of field work. The teachers will hike over the dunes with Dr. Marsh, Dr. Lamp, and Richard Billings of


Lab Pension Contributions

Users Center Gets a Face Lift

Renovations to the Users Center are right on schedule, with contractors making major changes to the interior of the building. Some of these changes include a new roof, and new plumbing, heating and air conditioning. The east house, including the game room, is now closed and will remain closed until the end of construction.

Marilyn Paul, Head of the Activities Office, explained, "The lounge itself is not changing in character, but you can look forward to a revamped interior. We plan to make the Users Center a more comfortable and versatile place for users and employees alike. Until construction is completed, though, 'please pardon our dust'."

Construction Engineering Services, headed by Wayne Nestander, did the design work, trouble-shooting, and problem solving on the project. Vic Kuchler, currently assigned to Business Services, is Task Manager on the project and was instrumental in the design. Universities Research Association, Inc., is the primary benefactor for this remodelling.

Currently, entrance to the Users Center has been routed to the south door located on Che-Che Pinqua. After construction is finished, the new entrance to the Users Center will be located on the west wall of the game room. Other changes include a new garden room adjacent to the new entrance, and a new t.v. room. The existing restrooms will also be remodelled.

Chez Leon will remain open for Thursday dinners throughout construction, but when the roof over the east house is replaced, Chez Leon may have to revise its Wednesday lunch schedule.

On the west end of the Users Center, a new restroom will be added for handicapped persons. Also on this end will be the music and library rooms, which are designated as "No Smoking" areas.

During the entire construction phase the lounge will remain open as usual from 5:00 p.m. to midnight, Monday through Friday, and from 7:00 p.m. to midnight on Saturday.

Participants will be viewing planets and constellations through telescopes with the guidance of Dr. Sweitzer and Mr. Sievers.

The FFLA Summer Institute for Science and Mathematics Teachers is providing a wide range of opportunities to enrich, broaden, and revitalize the teachers' knowledge in a compact 4-week program. These teachers will go on to share what they have learned with their students for years to come. The SIST is funded by a grant from the National Science Foundation, and by Abbott Laboratories, Furnas Foundation, Inc., the Forest Fund, The Grainger Foundation, and the DuPage/Kane Educational Service Region.
