Subject: Fermilab Home Page and FUE/WWW Meeting

Judy Jackson presented the proposed design for the Fermilab Home Page to the FUE/WWW meeting on March 15, 1994. A copy of her proposal in paper draft form is attached. For the details of the meeting, I refer you to my notes that are also attached. By and large, there was general agreement on the proposal presented.

Judy Jackson also presented the draft to her management (Ken Stanfield) who has given it his blessing. (See the attached copy of the electronic mail message.)

We are therefore proceeding with implementing the Fermilab Home Page as outlined by Judy Jackson in her presentation.

Judy Jackson will provide the basic text for the page. Liz will work with Judy in the development of the text and editing. Judy Nicholls and/or I will provide and/or get whatever help Judy and Liz need with some of the technical/physics wording. Matt Wicks indicated his willingness to help find a suitable, facility-style, always-up machine. In Trang's absence, Shelly Malinski will provide assistance with WWW and UNIX for the purposes of getting the Fermilab Home Page going. Judy Nicholls will collect names of those at Fermilab managing existing WWW servers, let them know of our efforts to put together a Fermilab Home Page, and invite them along with the FUE/WWW group to review it when it becomes available on WWW in draft form. Assuming we reach consensus, we will put it into operation. Before that, we will have established some sort of "sign-off" procedure for those wishing to have their servers listed on the Fermilab Home Page--whereby we can get their management to OK the listing of such servers.

My target date for getting V1 of the Fermilab Home Page up is Monday, April 11.

Judy Jackson and Liz have indicated that they may want to employ a graphics artist in regard to the several tag icons. I am hopeful that we can proceed with the implementation, obtain such designs at modest cost, and incorporate them into the home page later when they become available.
